**Subject: Recommendations of the Standing on Social Justice & Empowerment contained in Twenty Ninth Report – Reg.**

**Sir,**

Please refer to the copy of letter no.1-5/PS/PREM dated 21.04.2008 requesting NSKFDC to furnish the reply on the para 1.7 of Part-1 of the report on the above captioned subject. The reply of NSKFDC is as under: -

- 2) NSKFDC recognizes Skill Development as an important means to assist the unemployed Safai Karamcharis youth to develop & upgrade their skills in trades having good potentials for self employment and opportunities for wage employment.
- 3) Under the existing policy, 100% cost of the programme as grants including stipend upto Rs.500/- per candidate/month is given to support them during training & cost of tool-kit to the trainees are being provided through concerned State Channelising Agencies (SCAs). Further, the training programmes are being preferably sponsored through Government/ Semi Govt./Autonomous Govt. Bodies.
- 4) Skill & Entrepreneurial Development training programme has been a regular feature of the NSKFDC. Normally about Rs.1.00 crore are earmarked for conducting the training programmes in each financial year. As on 31.03.2008, NSKFDC has sanctioned Skill & Entrepreneurial Development training programmes to upgrade the skill of 6986 trainees with total cost of Rs.563.65 lac.
- 5) NSKFDC has been achieving the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) targets for covering number of trainees and disbursement of funds for conducting Skill Development Training Programmes.
- 6) Short term Skill Development Training Programmes upto 6 month durations in potential trades are conducted. The placement assistance is provided to the successful trainees by the training institutions. The trainees are also informed of the facilities available for taking loans in case they wish to set-up their own ventures with financial assistance under NSKFDC/SCA programmes. Coverage of trainees under NSKFDC/SCA schemes for setting-up own ventures, are considered on priority. On passing the examinations conducted by the training institutions, certificates are issued by the respective training institution. The candidates are advised to keep in touch with the concerned officer of SCA in the State/UT and also be on the look out for newspaper advertisements in the leading national/regional dailies.

7) NSKFDC sanctions the training programmes of hi-tech & the trades which have adequate potential for job/self employment. The detail of major training programmes sanctioned by NSKFDC is given as under:
